PROMISLingua National Workshops

The **PROMISLingua** project started the National Workshops which are tasks of Work Package 6. The aim of the Workshops is to allow SME users to test the features of the PROMIS® solution in people own language. This will allow SME users to understand the benefits of using PROMIS® as a tool to ease compliance and support continuous improvement for their company.

PROMISLingua Presented at UAEPME FOOD FORUM

During the UEAPME Food Forum, which took place on the 2nd July in Brussels, PROMISLingua and the resulting solutions were presented to representatives SMEs working in the Food sector by Mrs Caterina Berbenni-Rehm from PRO-MIS@Service.

The UEAPME Food Forum met this week where members were updated by Mr. Rogge (DG SAN-CO) on the new EC proposal for the inspection fees Regulation 1169/2011. They discussed the recent developments in the Guideline Daily Amounts (GDA) Hybrid Scheme, the UK front-of-pack nutrition labelling scheme, which is an unacceptable burden and cost, especially for small food producers. Furthermore, they were informed about indication of allergens for unpacked food, legal cooking temperatures and more specifically about the UK experience and its comparison with other Member States. Finally, the PROMISLingua project was presented by Mrs Caterina Berbenni-Rehm with its possible use in the food sector.

Kick-Off meeting for the CEN-CWA 75 Standardisation

CEN has recently created/ established a new Workshop on *Terminology* Policy to Support Generic Applications of Management Systems with focus on Smaller Organisations in a Multilingual Environ*ment*. The project kickoff meeting took place in Brussels on 29 and 30 July 2013 in Brussels.

The main purpose of the project is to develop a CWA integrating the results of the EU research project PROMISLingua and to explain the methodology of the project for ease of application in smaller organisations. The target stakeholders are Small and Mediumsized Enterprises (SMEs) that are now facing steadily increasing require-ments from standards and regulations related to environmental, quality performance, health and safety, ICT Security & Data protection and other

issues at local, national and international levels. Currently, SMEs cannot afford appropriate personnel and financial resources to cope efficiently in meeting these demands, they need tailored business services to help them overcome the challenging requirements of effectively and safely operating their on-going activities.
